Look after

- Spanish: Cuidar
 - Synonym: Take care of
 - Example: I look after my little sister after class.

Give up

- Spanish: Rendirse / Dejar de
 - Synonym: Quit
 - Example: He gave up smoking last year.
-



Pick up

- Spanish: Recoger
 - Synonym: Collect
 - Example: I will pick you up at the Metrovalencia station.

- Spanish: Continuar
 - Synonym: Continue
 - Example: Please carry on with your presentation.

- Spanish: Quedarse sin
 - Synonym: Have no more
 - Example: We ran out of paper in the library printer.

- Spanish: Rechazar
 - Synonym: Reject
 - Example: She turned down the job offer from Renfe.

- Spanish: Posponer
 - Synonym: Postpone
 - Example: They put off the meeting until next week.

Find out

- Spanish: Descubrir / Enterarse
 - Synonym: Discover / Learn
 - Example: I found out about the Erasmus programme yesterday.

Set up

- Spanish: Establecer / Montar
 - Synonym: Establish
 - Example: They set up a study group at the Universitat de València.
